

Sensory and Music Story: Time Machine - The 1960's

This 'Sensory and Music Story' has been designed to be used either by a parent / carer and child at home, or as part of a Music Therapy session at Little Havens.

Hints and tips:

- Gather all the props before you start. If you do not have everything exactly, don't worry – any improvisations are fine!
- Familiarise yourself with the story and what happens where. Think how you will use the props and songs to make the most impact and sense to the child you are working with.
- It is natural to feel self-conscious about singing, but there are no 'X Factor' style judgements being made about your voice! If you can sing with more confidence and volume then that will make more of an impact - it does not matter if you are out of tune (or think you are!).
- If you have other small instruments at home, you may want to use these with the child you are working with during the songs.
- Read the story slowly, repeating the part of the story that has just been read when feeling the relevant props. If the child is responsive to a certain part – or you know from previous experience that they will enjoy something – then stay longer with that prop or song.

Props:

Time Machine hats / lights eg torch / metallic sounds – eg cutlery! Salad spinner **Tambourine** Protest / peace signs

Scarves

Flowers, sun glasses, tie dye

'Mud' to feel (eg cocoa powder, cornflour and water), water spray Lava lamp or any glow in the dark









The Story:

It was a lovely sunny day - where shall we go today in our Time Machine?

Song: We're all going to the 1960's

Ok, let's get going and get our time machine hats on!

Feel: Time machine hats and noise / lights

Have we made it to the 1960's? Let's carefully take our time machine hats off and find out!

Song: Welcome to the 60's

Well it definitely seems like we are here! There was so much good music written in the 1960s – I hope we get to sing along to some of it! They listened to records in the 1960s rather than streaming on itunes – the records spun round and round!

Feel: Salad spinner record players!

Sing: Hit the Road Jack (?) – getting faster / stopping with the

spinning.

The Beatles were one of the biggest bands in the 1960s – they came from Liverpool but were really famous in America – when they did they concerts you could hardly hear them playing because of everyone screaming!

Sing: Beatles medley – with screaming!

One of our favourite instruments was very popular in the 1960s too – the tambourine! It even had whole songs written about it!

Sing: Mr Tambourine Man

Play: Tambourines

Sometimes songs became really important for other reasons. In the 60s there were lots of peace marches and demonstrations against war and inequalities, and songs were sung as a protest and to help show how people felt.









Feel: Hold up signs

Sing: Blowin in the Wind - and feel scarves

How could we get more into feeling like we were in the 60s? We came across some hippies, who invited us along in their camper van – so we made sure that we were dressed like them, with hippy flower power, and got on the bus to go on a trip!

Feel: Flowers, sunglasses etc, tie dye

Sing: We're all going on a Summer Holiday

They took us to Woodstock – a massive music festival! There were thousands of people here listening to lots of different bands – even though it rained and was muddy!

Feel: Mud! And water spray

Sing: A Little Help From my Friends – Joe Cocker

After all that we needed to just chill out for a while. They were very good at chilling out in the 60's – sitting around and watching lava lamps, or in the dark at psychedelic pictures like the smiley face.

Watch: Lava projection, glow in the dark

At the end of the 1960s, the world changed again with millions of people tuning in to watch the moon landings on tv.

Listen: 'One small step for man...'

Sing: Zoom Zoom We're Going to the Moon

And with that ,we realised that we should get back in the time machine and go back to the future...

Feel: Time machine hats and song

... as the stars were beginning to come out. Thank you for coming with us in the time machine!! **Sing:** Twinkle Twinkle
